B.S. Business Administration (BSBA) Admission Requirements

All students, including freshmen or transfer students, entering Middle Georgia State University with an interest in business are placed in the School of Business for advising and will remain with the same advisor through graduation. Students must complete 60 hours with a minimum overall 2.25 GPA and a “C” or higher in each of the courses (listed below) before being formally admitted to the BSBA program and selecting one of our five concentrations: Accounting, Management, Marketing, General Business, or Productions/Operations Management.

- ❖ ENGL 1101 /1102—English Composition 1 and 2
- ❖ One of: MATH 1001 (Quantitative Reasoning), MATH 1101 (Introduction to Mathematical Modeling), MATH 1111 (College Algebra), MATH 1112 (Plane Trigonometry), MATH 1113 (Pre-Calculus), or MATH 1251 (Calculus I)
- ❖ MATH 1200—Elementary Statistics
- ❖ ACCT 2101/2102—Principles of Accounting 1 and 2
- ❖ ECON 2105/2106—Principles of Macroeconomics and Microeconomics
- ❖ ITEC 2201—Business Information Applications, and
- ❖ BUSA 2105—Communicating in the Business Environment.

All students must submit an application for admission into the School of Business’ BSBA program. Once a student completes forty-five (45) hours, a School of Business “hold” will automatically be placed on the student’s account that will not allow the student to register for the next semester until the application has been submitted. The hold is a reminder to submit the application. The hold will be removed by contacting the student’s advisor and submitting the application. The application is available through the link on this website.

Students may be granted “provisional acceptance” into the BSBA program if they have completed forty-five (45) credit hours and have successfully completed or are currently enrolled in the courses listed above. Students meeting these criteria are encouraged to meet with their advisor to request authorization to enroll in upper-level courses.
