	to have been effective as the success rate rose
	from 71.43% to 78.57%, almost meeting the
	program goal.
	Assessment Initiative/Plan for Upcoming Year:
	The IDS curriculum committee met and decided
	to keep the learning initiative implemented in
	AY21-22 (students will hand in a draft of the
	paper). Upon review of the IDS Writing Rubric by
	the IDS curriculum committee, "Mechanics and
	MLA" was identified as an area of challenge for
	students. An additional learning initiative will
	therefore be implemented in AY 22-23: a
	workshop targeting MLA format.
